From Vicar Mike: The Season of Epiphany 2024

On January 6th, we celebrate Epiphany. Epiphany reveals Jesus to the world. In Matthew 2:1-12, the magi bring gifts to honor Jesus. The symbolic meaning of each gift tells part of the story of who Jesus is: gold for a king, frankincense to honor the divine, myrrh for burial. We bring gifts to Jesus in our lives too in the form of our time, our labor, our talents, and our monetary offerings.

During the time after Epiphany, the church celebrates the gift of the gospel being shared throughout the world. There is no better reminder of this gift than the arrival of the magi. These are Gentiles, not Jews, the wrong people to show up. Even worse, they were astrologers, a practice forbidden by the Torah. Yet these are the people who travel long days to bring amazing gifts to Jesus. Surely the birth of Jesus is a gift for all people everywhere.

Discerning signs from God in our lives is often difficult. The Epiphany star was a sign from God that the magi knew to follow. God has not stopped giving signs to the world, and there are often "stars" in our lives that lead us to Jesus. Think about the times in your life when you had to make a big decision. What helped you make that decision? Did you ask God to help you? Did you receive some kind of sign? Let's spend a little more time this year in prayer with God and look for the signs he gives us. Who knows what gifts we might find? We might find Jesus in the places we least expect. Amen.

As we close out a very busy year, we look forward to another busy year. Right out of the gate we have a Special Congregational Meeting on January 7 for a Call Vote. We have our Congregational

Annual Meeting on January 21. Finally, assuming the Call Vote goes well, there will be an Ordination on February 3. That is all in the first five weeks of 2024. We also look forward to a Confirmation Service in April, graduations in May, and Clermont's 175th anniversary celebration in July. There are many more things to look forward to in 2024, but this is just a taste of what is in the year to come.
